Traditional Khmer dance performance



This beautiful dance has been a part of Khmer culture for well more than a millennium, during the Angkorian era it was enjoyed by kings and common folk alike. The dances are better described as dance-dramas as they also convey a story or message. This dance form is an important piece of Khmer cultural heritage. Like so many other Cambodian traditions Apsara dancing was almost destroyed during the Khmer Rouge regime but got revived in the 1980s and 90s, in large part to the extraordinary efforts of Princess Bopha Devi
