During the age of Angkor Khmer pottery was an intricate art but the long years of war and endurances its craftsmen along with their knowledge were lost. Every day Khmer antique ceramics are illegally traded and exported from Cambodia, threatening to extinguish this fine chapter of Khmer culture and history. The National Centre for Khmer Ceramics Revival have been working since 2006 to rebirth this art and raise awareness about its national requirement. It is possible to visit the centre to learn more about this and try your hand at the potter's wheel. The centre has recreated an ancient 8 meters long Khmer kiln to help breath life into this old art



How to get there

The centre is located close to Road nr 6 on its way west out of town and is reachable by moto, bicycle, tuk-tuk, car or van. Can be combined with a trip to Silk Farm, Sangkheum center or West Baray.
